### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The mid-year Reporting to Parents event took place last week with many parents taking the opportunity to speak to teachers regarding student progress. The turn out of parents was excellent and is worth the cost of suspending the timetable in terms of less student instruction time. Immediate feedback from speaking to some parents was that the on-line booking system worked as they could manage their own appointments and the 10 minute timeslot was seen as reasonable.

Parents also appreciated having the reports posted home prior to the reporting day as they could book appointments based on teacher feedback. Whilst some parents chose not to book appointments, they did so based on the report. The next P&C meeting will be a forum that the reporting day can be considered by parents.

Since the last Update the Semester 1 concerts have been held. It was pleasing to see so many in the audience to listen to the school's many ensembles. The standard of playing was excellent and a testament to the quality of the school's Music staff and visiting directors from the School of Instrumental Music. A number of parent and student volunteers also so ably assisted the conduct of the concerts. Whether the job was small or large, performed publicity such as arranging the stage or behind the scenes, this help is very much appreciated. It adds value to the event and enables the teachers to focus on the ensembles. To those parents assisting in this way, thank you.

Several years ago, the government made a decision that students could not wear denim to school and uniforms were to be worn. Like all schools, Mount Lawley SHS undertook extensive consultation with parents over the design of the new uniform. The P&C has always had a major role to play in the school's uniform. The current uniform is widely supported by parents and has been since it was instituted. At its last meeting, School Council reaffirmed supported for the current uniform, which includes the woollen jumper and rain jacket.

uniform. Uniform items may be purchased from the Uniform Shop, which is open on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 8:00am to 11:30am.

Preparation for 2012 is underway, especially for Year 11 with Year 10s now undertaking subject selections. It is critical that students select a program where they can achieve success. If courses are selected that are too difficult for students then they may not be positioned for Graduation or for post-school options. Selecting programs that are too difficult close doors and this needs to be considered in the counselling process.

Entry to TAFE is also undergoing change and students studying Certificates in a school VET program are better postured than those just studying Level 1 courses. A number of industry bodies favour Stage 2 in English and Mathematics, which together with a Certificate qualification enhances entry to TAFE. These factors should be considered in selecting Year 11 subjects. Specialist advice in the Vocational area is available from school staff.

This is the last Update for Term 2. All students and families are wished a relaxing break. Whilst teachers return to school on Monday, 25 July 2011, students commence the next day, Tuesday, 26 July 2011.

Most University Open Days are held in late July and August (see dates listed below). However, you can visit a university at any time, just contact the university's Prospective Students Centre and talk to the staff to arrange a time and date.

### **What happens on an Open Day?**

On Open Day you will see the university at its best. Everyone is there – academics, lecturers, current students and information officers. More importantly, you can talk with academics, lecturers and current students about what certain courses are actually like, and what is required to get into them.

### **Who should attend an Open Day?**

Anyone who is considering studying at a tertiary level in the next few years should attend.







### **Why should you attend an Open Day?**

Apart from the opportunity to obtain course information there are many other reasons why attending an Open Day is a good idea:

- You are going to feel more comfortable arriving at a university or TAFE institute on the first day of classes if you have been there before.
- What is really involved in the course or courses you are interested in?
- If you have to move away from home, where are you going to live?
- Will you be happier studying in a large metropolitan institution or a smaller, perhaps rural institution?
- What does the place 'feel' like? Is it a bustling environment with lots of activity or a quieter, more relaxed campus set in landscaped grounds?
- How are you going to get there? Is it close to public transport or should you start saving now for a car?
- If you don't know the answers to any of these questions, then you should attend an Open Day!
- How to make the best of Open Days
- To make your Open Day visits fun and informative, here are some pointers:
- Write down a list of questions you would like to ask about particular courses
- Be there early. Crowds tend to develop as the day progresses
- On arrival, get a map from a central point and ask for directions to the relevant faculties or schools
- Ask questions!
- Don't spend the day collecting printed information only. Use the opportunity to speak directly with academics before applications close
- Introduce yourself to selection officers if you feel it is appropriate, but don't be pushy
- Check out the residential colleges, if available. After all, it is you that will be living there.
- Walk around the campus. Have a good look! See what sporting facilities and other services are available. Enjoy the visit!

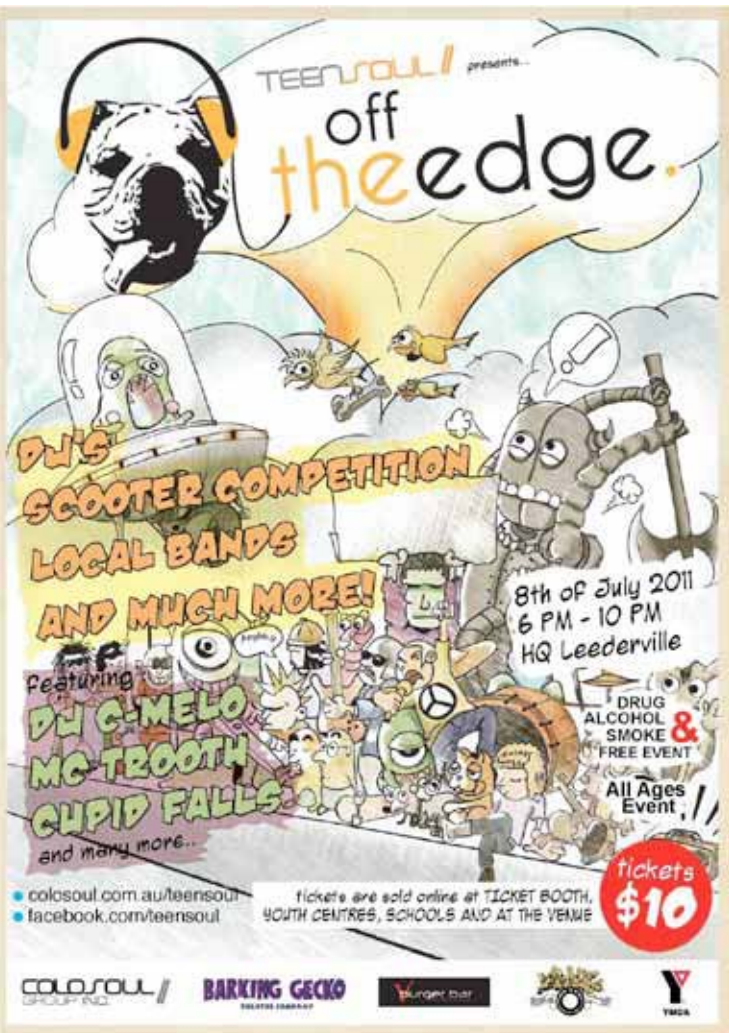
