2. Apologies

3. Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The minutes of the last general meeting held on November 24 th 2004 were accepted as a true and accurate record. Passed: Rob, Seconded: Charmian.

Business arising: Terry said that daycleaners have now been employed instead of contractors. New equipment has also arrived.

4. Analysis of Year 12 Performance

Terry referred to the document he tabled at the AGM in February. Document should be referred to for finer details, however Terry did make some concluding comments about the analysis: As a cohort, the group was not as strong in the 90+ end, was strong in the 80+ grade, but strongest in the 70+, which is the average uni entrance level. The average TER score increased last year to 74.8%, so as a cohort more students actually got into uni last year than the year before. In terms of did the school get the students where they wanted to go, 71% of students who wanted a uni place were offered one, 67% accepted those places, 82.5% got their first choice and 17.5% got offered their second choice. So more students got into university (as a cohort %) and they were offered their first and second choices.

Next semester Terry advised there would be enriching classes targeting 7 courses in the TER. After school for 1.5hrs, 8 sessions, cost \$50. This was about promoting excellence, doing better overall and countering any negative impact of building programme. Study skills sessions for year 12's will also be starting later in year as well.

Questions to The Principal .

Impact of Building Programme on results : Can't be measured, probably some effect, didn't reflect in the results as negative.

Impact on reporting and outcome structure: Year 12 last year were still in old structure.

Support for struggling TER students: Yes, not sure how it will look, definitely study skills sessions being looked at.

How many students from 2003 cohort stayed at uni: info not available at this stage.

Need for more info on other 60% of students (non TER): 20% went to Tafe, but 40% unsure of path.

Should study skills start in Year 11: Discussion about this occurring already with the philosophy going back to start in Year 8 eventually.

Maintaining future enrolment at MLSHS: Comments made about the impact of new buildings and popularity of SVAPA programme for attracting new students. But if this wears off, how will we attract numbers in future years? Discussion centred on aiming for TER scores of 75% and above to get positive polling in the West Australian results table, which, for good or bad, is what a lot of parents read and judge a school by.

More Parent involvement early in Year 11: Comments made that the transition could be stronger, with more involvement encouraged, giving parents a realistic idea of expectations eg homework levels at min 3 hrs night etc.

Choosing year 11 subjects: Comments made about timetabling balanced with counseling on courses from Year 10-11. Year 11 student info night could possibly be better in terms of wider amount of information about different choices for students, especially non TER options. Terry commented that it was a school priority that future emphasis be on Students being put into the pathways correct for them, not just TER as an emphasis.
