6.	Report on 2006 results	A report "A Consideration of the 2006 Year 12 Results" was tabled and discussed. State-wide results prepared by the Curriculum Council were tabled for information.	
7.	Principal's Report	T Boland briefed Council on relevant matters noting in particular the school's heavy enrolment numbers. In excess of 1,350 students are currently enrolled for 2007 most of whom are in-boundary following recent boundary changes. The changes may mean that in future students from nearby suburbs such as Inglewood who have traditionally always been accepted may miss out on enrolment. He commented that with the strong demand there is increasing pressure to take additional students. Numbers for 2007 have not yet been finalised.
