'Congratulations to all the talented students from across Australia who took part in the Chinese Bridge competition we hosted on the weekend. Your enthusiasm showed how learning a language helps cross boundaries - even ones made necessary by COVID-19 travel restrictions!

On 8 August, 12 high school students from the ACT, NT, SA and WA took to Zoom to show off their Chinese speaking skills. If that wasn't challenging enough, they also completed a written general knowledge test in Chinese and submitted videos demonstrating their talents at Chinese singing, dancing, cooking, tea art and calligraphy.

The students were competing in the regional final of this year's Chinese Bridge (Hanyu Qiao) Chinese Proficiency Competition for Secondary Students, which took place online for the first time.....'

Suu Kyi along with 5 students from other states entered finals and now they go the to the next round of the competition.....

"The greatest power of language is that it allows us to unite with each other... to meet the challenges of facing unpredictable difficulties so that we can combine our efforts to build a better future world," CI Associate Director Fu Zheng said.
