5. ECU MT LAWLEY REDEVELOPMENT

MLSHS Board Chair Professor Stephen Wynn provided an update in relation to the needs of the school as they relate to the proposed redevelopment of, and previous commitments made by the State Government in relation to, ECU:

- MLSHS has two major priorities for facilities – an auditorium and the need for create facilities that had been intended to be filled by the WAAPA buildings at least four meetings with senior Department of Education representatives where space, the lack of an auditorium and the need for appropriate arts facilities given school emphasis on creative arts were highlighted including that the facilities are not fit for purpose for school aged children so would need a refit;
- have also highlighted in a meeting with the Member for Mt Lawley ,Frank Paolino MLA, that the forward estimates don't include specific funding for an auditorium or reference to the school's needs as well as co-use with the community;
- the Board will be writing to the Premier, cc'ing the Minister for Education, Hon John Carey Member for Perth and Hon Simone McGurk, Minister for Creative Industries.
- seeking P&C support to write as Board Chair to the Premier and Ministers in relation to the above, and noting that the P&C will be writing separately;
- there are 1700 families that will be impacted by this decision and anticipate parents may raise the issue with their local member in terms of future plans for the site;

Motion: P&C to:

- (i) support the Board Chair writing to the Premier, cc'ing Ministers, in relation to the school's needs and use of ECU/WAAPA facilities; and
- (ii) write a letter in similar terms, referring to the Board letter and media statement dated 17 February 2026 released by the Minister for Planning and Minister for Creative Industries, and advise parents that it has done so,
